### ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

It is a truth universally acknowledged that since 1979 we have made great strides in reducing the numbers of people killed or injured in crashes involving drinking and driving. Yet even with this progress, around 14% of road deaths involve a driver over the legal limit.

In addition, drug driving represents one of the great unknowns of road safety. We know that it happens. We know that it happens far more often and among certain age groups than the data suggests. What is the best way of reducing the incidence of drugs and driving?

Furthermore, even if we have succeeded in reducing the level of drink-driving, what should we do if new challenges appear such as more drinking by women and the impact of longer and later opening hours?

This conference will focus on the new challenges emerging for dealing with impaired drivers. It will highlight new research into women and alcohol and review the proposed new offence of drug-driving contained in the Crime and Courts Bill currently passing through the Houses of Parliament.
